### SCEL to Mark Tenth Anniversary

The Southeastern Center for the Enhancement of Learning was established in 2000 as an Authorized Training Center for Professor Reuven Feuerstein's Cognitive Enrichment Programs. Activities during 2010 will mark our Tenth Anniversary. When SCEL was first organized, Director Dr. Martha M. Wood, who had already been conducting training classes for two years, was the only certified trainer. Now SCEL has four Certified IE Trainers (Dr. Martha Wood, Dr. Elles Taddeo, Dr. Joyce Swofford and Dr. Jan Scott) -- and two Certified LPAD Trainers (Dr. Wood and Dr. Cynthia Brilliant who joined SCEL as an adjunct Trainer in 2008). In addition there is an office manager, Lois Collins, a webmaster, Martha Wicker, and a marketing consultant, Dr. Chris Wood. Dr. Jan Scott, who was named Assistant Director in 2008, also serves as Research Coordinator. Jan Burnett and Kay Shellnut are certified teachers of Instrumental Enrichment and we hope they will become certified trainers soon.

From a beginning in 2000 when we offered one course at the time, we have been able to offer all levels of IE Training, for both Standard and Basic courses, and for LPAD Training during our summer workshops.

Plan now to join us for our Tenth Anniversary Celebration in April. You are all invited.

### SCEL Announces Plans for 2010 Annual Summer Workshops

Although Summer Training conducted at SCEL is primarily for classroom teachers, it is also appropriate for school counselors and administrators, educational therapists, staff development specialists, and parents. All classes are conducted in English, and the training site is The Jones Memorial Community Learning Center at 5320 Phillips Dr., Lake City, Georgia. Classes are held Monday through Friday from 8 A.M. to 5:00 P. M.

The training fee for each class will be \$850. The training fee includes all materials, a light lunch, and two breaks each day. Participants will have a choice for lunch, and special dietary needs will be accommodated when possible, with advance notice. The Conference Hotel will be Country Inn and Suites—Morrow. Moderately priced conference rates will be available. Transportation will be provided from the Conference Hotel to the Training Site.

*All classes will be offered subject to adequate enrollment. To assure a place, we ask that you register by April 15, 2010. We suggest that you not purchase non-refundable travel tickets until you have verified that the class you are interested in has adequate enrollment. ## Update on NAFA

The following information was submitted by the North American Feuerstein Alliance for inclusion in this issue of Learning Landscapes:

As some of you reading this might already know, about two years ago, a group of Feuerstein followers in North America organized a network called the North American Feuerstein Alliance (NAFA). It was incorporated in March 2008, having 38 members during its first official year, and of course we want to expand our membership base to all practitioners and trainers of FIE and LPAD as well as to any other persons benefiting from or interested in supporting and advancing Feuerstein programs. NAFA membership is open to anyone living in the United States, Mexico, or Canada. As an alliance of individuals interested in the theory and applied practices based on Professor Reuven Feuerstein's work, our sole purpose is to encourage, support, and promote the use of Feuerstein theory, work, and programs to improve the cognitive abilities of children and adults in North America. Currently, NAFA has no intent in selling any product. In September, our application was approved for us to be a legal non-profit 501 (c) 3 corporation, meaning that contributions (but NOT our dues) to NAFA are tax deductible as charitable contributions.

Up to now we have been communicating via email messages and our first two newsletters sent in September and October. We have purchased a domain site for our webpage and are working on developing that medium as a basis for our information exchange. We also have made available a directory of email addresses of all members that can be used for networking with each other.

We encourage everyone reading this SCEL newsletter who is not currently a member of NAFA to download the application using the link provided on our SCEL website and join during this fall's membership drive. NAFA can then add you to their email list and put you in a network with other Feuerstein contacts. ## LPAD Assessments

Since its inception, SCEL has been vitally interested in making training for the Learning Propensity Assessment Device available in the United States. For several years we were the only ATC that offered LPAD Training, and we frequently have inquiries from parents and others about LPAD practitioners in particular locations. Sometimes from our own knowledge we are able to make recommendations from among those who have trained at SCEL, but often we have no knowledge of LPAD Practitioners in the locations requested.
